



CALL FOR PRESENTATIONS GREEN CONSTRUCTION WEBINAR SERIES

AGC of America is seeking proposals for webinars derived from AGC's *Building to LEED® for New Construction* course. These 90 minute webinars should be targeted toward individuals engaged in commercial construction who want to learn more about the impact of individual credits in the field and best practices to achieve them.

Following the format of the course material, seven webinars, one to provide an introduction to green building, one on each of the New Construction and Major Renovations™ credit categories, and one on Innovation in Design and Regional Priority credits, will be presented throughout the summer and fall of 2011. Interested individuals are encouraged to submit one or multiple presentations for consideration. All proposals are due no later than June 1, 2011 before 5:00 PM EDT.

The primary focus of the green construction webinar series will be to provide a several short professional development sessions, using content from AGC's *Building to LEED for New Construction* course, on specific green building areas that are potential pitfalls and to provide ways other contractors have succeeded in achieving those credits. This is a perfect opportunity to showcase what your firm has done while building green.

Webinar Format

Each webinar in the series will be:

- 90 minutes in duration, inclusive of a question and answer period
- Designed for an audience of commercial construction personnel who have field roles
- A web-based PowerPoint presentation with verbal narration
- Delivered live to an audience and recorded for possible future use
- Submitted to the US Green Building Council for Green Building Certification Institute Continuing Education Hours as well as other CEU organizations.
- An opportunity for participants to engage in their learning. Examples of features in our interactive webinar tool include the ability to:
 - Receive and answer questions throughout the presentation
 - Poll the audience
 - Encourage participants to type feedback or answers to questions.

Proposal Submission

- The presentation category from which webinar material will be used. Please select:
 - Introduction to Green Building
 - Sustainable Sites
 - Water Efficiency
 - Energy and Atmosphere
 - Materials and Resources
 - Indoor Environmental Quality
 - Innovation in Design and Regional Priority
- A resume or curriculum vitae for all individuals presenting the webinar, highlighting green building experience.
- A three to four sentence summary of the presentation/webinar
- Four to five learning objectives (pulled directly from the *Building to LEED* session or altered slightly in order to adequately address delivery of content)
- A presentation outline including notation of any interactive activities and the specific designation of the portion of the material that will be covered.
 - For example, if submitting for the Site Selection category, it is noted that special emphasis will be paid to something your company did with SSc5.1.
 - All presentations should plan to have a type of audience interaction (survey of their experience, engaging their feedback to a statement, quick question on what they just learned) every 10-15 minutes. Please provide examples of these interactions.
- A list of participant material necessary for the presentation if any
- Available dates to give the webinar in June thru November 2011.

If your proposal is selected, you will be asked to provide the comprehensive PowerPoint for your presentation, pulled from *Building to LEED* and augmented with your own examples as well as a 5 question multiple choice and true and false assessment for CEU approval.
