New Construction Outlook to Show How Contractors are Preparing to Meet Demand for the Year As They Face New Workforce and Tariff Challenges, Adopt New Technology Construction Association and Sage Will Release their 2025 Construction Hiring & Business Outlook During Live Media Briefing on Wednesday, January 8 at 1 p.m. EST

On **Wednesday, January 8 at 1 p.m. EST**, the Associated General Contractors of America and Sage will release their national, regional and state* construction hiring and business forecasts for 2025 during a virtual media briefing.
