Dear Mr. McCarragher,

I am responding to your February 15, 2024 request that the Office of Management and Budget (OMB) review the Buy America Build America Act waiver-request practices of 19 agencies under the Paperwork Reduction Act (PRA), 44 U.S.C. § 3517(b). OMB plans to respond separately to your petition for rulemaking under 5 U.S.C. § 553(e).

As described in more detail below, for each of the agencies identified in your letter, any potential PRA concern has since been addressed, as the agencies are either using an OMB-approved common form sponsored by the Department of Agriculture, using their own OMB-approved form, or are not subject to the PRA because they are not conducting collections or are expected to receive fewer than 10 submissions annually. *See* 44 U.S.C. § 3502(3)(A).

In particular:

- Eight agencies are using an OMB-approved common form sponsored by the Department of Agriculture (OMB Control No. 0505-0028): the Departments of Defense, Interior, Agriculture, Commerce, Labor, Veterans Affairs, and Homeland Security, and the Environmental Protection Agency.
- Three agencies are using their own approved forms: the Departments of the Treasury (1505-0250), Transportation (2120-0569, 2130-0615), and Energy (1910-5152).
- Eight agencies are not conducting collections or are expected to receive fewer than ten submissions annually and thus any waiver collections are not subject to the PRA: the Department of Justice, Department of Health and Human Services, Small Business Administration, General Services Administration, Social Security Administration, National Endowment for the Humanities, National Science Foundation, and Denali Commission.
